



If you are in the area a while longer, here are some suggestions for places to visit:

### **Old Sacramento**

A 28-acre National Historic Landmark along the banks of the Sacramento River, this area is full of restaurants and shops set within the time of the California Gold Rush and the Transcontinental Railroad. Visit the California Railway Museum and the California Museum; have lunch or dinner on the restored riverboat, the Delta King; take a ride on a horse-drawn carriage; follow docents in period costumes who lead historic walking tours; climb aboard the historic steam locomotive for a ride on the Sacramento Southern Railroad; or take a scenic one-hour Hornblower cruise.
